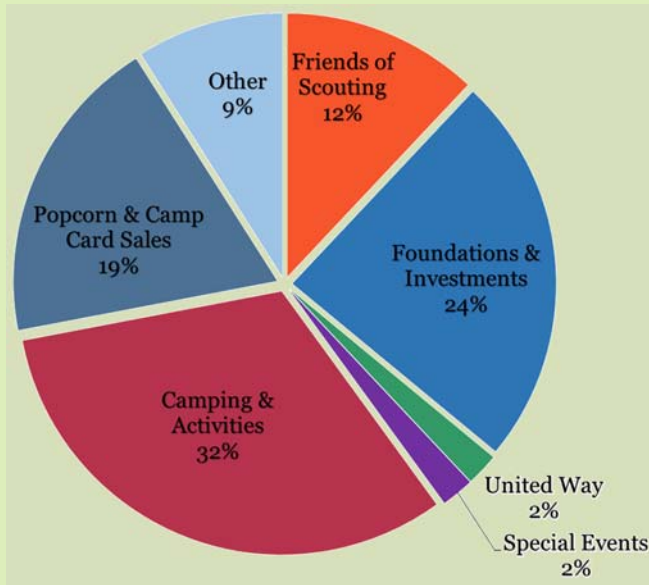

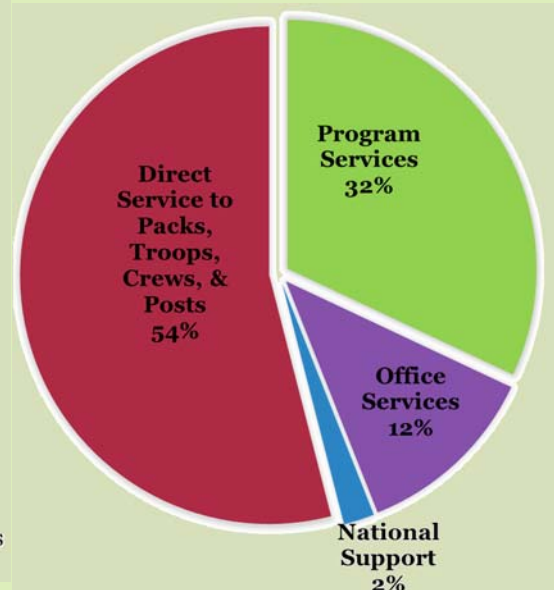
How Your Investment Works
